Although the Rocky Mountain Railroad Club had hoped to publish a book about the Rio Grande Scuthern Railroad, Club Officers and Directors were unable to reach an agreement with the author concerning the extent of editing required. The author insisted on retention of proven erroneous information and possibly libelous material, and it was decided that the book would not meet the high standards required for publication under the club's imprint. Morris Cafky was able to hasten completion of his manuscript, "Rails Around Gold Hill," which is announced in the enclosed brochure. This book will, I am sure, still further enhance the reputation which the club has acquired with publication of "Denver South Park & Pacific."
