MORE STEAM ENGINES IN WORLD THAN DIESEL;

DESPITE THE FACT THAT LOCOMOTIVE DIESELIZATION IN THIS COUNTRY HAS REACHED 97% OF ALL OPERATING RAIL POWER UNITS, U.S. DIESELIZATION REACHES 97% OF LOCO TOTAL THERE ARE STILL MORE STEAM ENGINES IN THE WORLD THAN DIESEL! AN ALMOST IMPOSSIBLE FACT TO BELIEVE AS WE VIEW WITH INCREASING ALARM AND CONCERN THE MOTIVE POWER SCENE IN THIS COUNTRY.

YET, ACCORDING TO A RECENT INTERNATIONAL SURVEY, OF THE 186,000 LOCOMOTIVE UNITS IN THE WORLD TODAY, 54% ARE STEAM (OR ABOUT 100,000). ON A CONTINENTAL BASIS, EUROPE (INCLUDING ENGLAND AND RUSSIA) HAS THE LARGEST NUMBER OF LOCOMOTIVES OF ALL KINDS: 105,000 UNITS (56% OF THE WORLD TOTAL). NEXT IN LINE IS North America with 36,200 units; Asia with 22,800; Central and South America, 11,300; Africa, 7700; AUSTRALASIA, 3600.

EUROPE IS ALSO THE LARGEST OWNER OF STEAM ENGINES, BUT ASIA OPERATES A HIGHER PERCENTAGE OF STEAMERS THAN ANY OTHER CONTINENT.

1882 DENVER & RIO GRANDE PROGRESS REPORT LAST MONTH WE PRESENTED A UNION PACIFIC STORY OF THE EARLY 1880'S AS REPORTED IN VOLUME I, NUMBER I, OF "THE EARNEST IN RECENTLY OPENED DENVER CORNERSTONE PRESBYTERIAN," UNCOVERED IN THE CORNERSTONE OF THE RECENTLY DEMOLISHED FIRST UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN DENVER. THE ISSUE WAS DATED JANUARY I, 1882, AND EXCERPTS WERE MADE AVAILABLE TO US BY CLUB MEMBER BOB ANDERSON. WE CONTINUE HERE WITH MORE 1882 NEWS OF THE DAY -- A D&RG CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS REPORT FROM THE SAME ISSUE.

DENVER & RIO GRANDE RAILWAY

THE MOST POPULAR, SAFE AND RELIABLE ROUTE BETWEEN DENVER AND COLORADO SPRINGS, MANITOU, PUEBLO, CANON CITY, GUNNISON, BUENA VISTA, LEADVILLE, ALAMOSA, DURANGO AND ESPANOLA, AND ALL OTHER POINTS IN SOUTHERN AND WESTERN COLORADO AND NORTHERN NEW MEXICO.
