

AS WE'VE ALREADY NOTED, SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, WILL SEE MEMBERS AND THEIR GUESTS CONVENE IN Boulder for the Club's 27th anniversary celebration and annual dinner. John Birmingham's ex-GREAT WESTERN #51 WILL HEAD OUR SPECIAL TRAIN THAT DAY FOR A RUN ALL THE WAY TO LONGMONT AND RETURN TO BOULDER, WITH PLENTY OF PHOTO STOPS BOTH WAYS.

THE NEXT DAY, SUNDAY THE 25TH, WILL SEE THE ARRIVAL OF UNION PACIFIC STEAM POWER IN DENVER FOR THE FIRST TIME IN NEARLY 10 YEARS AS THE JUST-REFURBISHED 8444 ROLLS INTO TOWN TO PULL A CLUB SPECIAL TO LARAMIE AND CHEYENNE. WE WILL TRAVEL NORTHBOUND ON THE LITTLE-USED DENT BRANCH, AND TOP SHERMAN HILL ON BOTH THE NEW AND OLD GRADES. AGAIN, AMPLE AND PARTICULARLY SCENIC PHOTO STOPS HAVE BEEN PLANNED, AND THERE WILL BE TIME IN CHEYENNE TO VIEW AND PHOTOGRAPH THE OTHER UP STEAMERS STORE THERE (INCLUDING THE 4000).

AND PLEASE KEEP IN MIND THAT THE PRICE OF THE SATURDAY TRIP INCLUDES TRAIN FARE, DINNER, AND BUS SERVICE BETWEEN BOULDER STATION AND THE HARVEST HOUSE; WHILE THE SUNDAY TICKET INCLUDES MEALS ALL DAY IN THE UNION PACIFIC'S FAMED CAFETERIA STYLE

SEND YOUR TICKET ORDER IN NOW. THE SATURDAY DINNER TRIP IS JUST \$10.00 FOR ADULTS AND \$7.00 FOR CHILDREN; THE SUNDAY UP RUN IS \$17.00 FOR ADULTS, CHILDREN, \$8.50. OR, TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE SPECIAL REDUCED RATE COMBINATION TICKET ... ONLY \$24.00 FOR ADULTS AND \$16.00 FOR CHILDREN. As usual, child rates apply between the ages of five and 11.

DEPARTURES, BOTH DAYS FROM DENVER UNION STATION, ARE SCHEDULED FOR 2:00 P.M. SATURDAY AND 7:00 A.M. Sunday, Mountain Daylight Time (clocks in Union Station are set on Mountain Standard so be sure TO ALLOW FOR THE DIFFERENCE).

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ALAMOSA-DURANGO TRAFFIC SLOWS TO TRICKLE

MANY READERS HAVE WRITTEN IN REQUESTING NEWS OF

CURRENT ACTIVITY ON RIO GRANDE'S ALAMOSA-DURANGO

NARROW GAUGE LINE

"JOURNEY TO YESTERYEAR". THERE IS NEWS, BUT IT ISN'T THE KIND WE LIKE TO REPORT.

THE LAST FREIGHT RUN OVER THE LINE WAS NEARLY TWO MONTHS AGO AND THE RAILROAD HAS NO PLANS TO OPERATE FURTHER TRAINS THIS YEAR (OTHER THAN THE UPOCOMING ANNUAL KIWANIS KOLOR KARAVAN). ALL FREIGHT TRAFFIC HAS BEEN DIVERTED TO THE ROAD'S MOTOR FREIGHT DIVISION, WHICH HAS BEEN HAULING MOST OF THE FREIGHT SINCE THE RAIL LINE WAS SHUT DOWN DURING THE HEAVY SNOWS OF THE WINTER OF 1964-65.

RIO GRANDE OFFICIALS HAVE MADE NO PUBLIC STATEMENTS CONCERNING THE FUTURE OF THE ALAMOSA-DURANGO NARROW GAUGE, BUT IT WOULD APPEAR THAT THE TWILIGHT OF SLIM GAUGE OPERATIONS IN COLORADO IS BEGINNING TO DARKEN THE HORIZON.

In the meantime, passenger totals on the Durange-Silverton run continue to soar and the tourist season just passed should go down in the record books as the best yet. This much, at least, should be around for a while. As soon as an official statement is made, we will report it here.
