

SOPER LOCOMOTIVE PRESENTATION CEREMONY AT THE COLORADO RAILROAD MUSEUM

SOPER LOCOMOTIVE PRESENTED TO THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN RAILROAD CLUB AT 2:00 PM on Sunday, FEBRUARY 15, 1970, over 100 club members gathered at the Colorado Railroad Museum near Golden to attend a presentation ceremony. Gertrude Soper, widow of club member Bill Soper, accompanied by many members of the Soper family, formally presented Bill's beautiful hand made live steam model of Colorado & Southern Railway No. 4 to the Rocky Mountain Railroad Club. Club President, Jim Ehernberger, acted as master of ceremonies and accepted the locomotive for the club. Bill Jones and Ron Hill were in attendance representing the Colorado Railroad Historical Foundation. The locomotive has been placed in a large glass case provided by Bob Richardson. Mac Poor and John Ingles painted the case and replaced some cracked glass. Carl E. C. Carlson engraved a small plaque which gives the story of the engine and its builder. The locomotive is now on display at the west entrance to the museum building.

Many of those who attended the event spent some time browsing through the interesting displays within the building and enjoyed seeing locomotives, rolling stock and historical railroad artifacts scattered around the grounds outside the building. Fortunately the weather was like spring. In past years the Soper family have been of much help to the club while the Pictorial Supplement to Denver South Park & Pacific was being written and edited. Bill's father and uncle were both South Park telegraphers and once were stationed at Alpine Pass and Boreas Pass depots at the same time. Bill himself worked for the Colorado & Southern for a number of years.

HIGH SPEED ABROAD WITHOUT PARTICULAR FANFARE, THE FRENCH AND GERMAN RAILROADS HAVE INITIATED 125-MPH PASSENGER TRAIN SERVICE, AND ITALY WILL FOLLOW SHORTLY. IN SWITZERLAND, SPEED LIMITS HAVE BEEN RAISED TO 90-110 MPH., AND THE PRINCIPAL NORTH-SOUTH AND EAST-WEST LINES ARE BEING REBUILT FOR 125-MPH SCHEDULES. TRAFFIC DENSITY IS ENORMOUS: 300 TRAINS (FREIGHT AND PASSENGER) PER DAY THROUGH THE GOTTHARD TUNNEL, AND THE MAIN STATION AT ZURICH IS BEING REBUILT TO HANDLE 1000 PASSENGER TRAINS DAILY. ALL OF THIS IS ELECTRICALLY POWERED. THE GERMANS ARE USING 9000-HP C-C LOCOMOTIVES, WHILE THE SWISS RELY ON 6500-HP B-B AND 6500-HP C-C DESIGNS FOR BOTH PASSENGER AND FREIGHT. THESE WILL BE SUPPLEMENTED BY SOME NEW B-B-B 10,600=HP UNITS. MEANWHILE, BACK ON THE PENN CENTRAL, PLANS TO DOUBLE HIGH-SPEED METROLINER SERVICE BETWEEN WASHINGTON AND NEW YORK HAVE BEEN SCRAPPED.
