

OTTO C. PERRY Born December 21, 1894, Died December 23, 1970. With the passing of Otto C. Perry, the Rocky Mountain Railroad Club lost one of its most distinguished members and greatest photographers. He was a charter member of the club, having been one of the group that organized the club in 1938. He served for many years as secretary.
