

PERRY MOVIES ACQUIRED BY CLUB THE OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS OF THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN RAILROAD CLUB ARE PLEASED TO ANNOUNCE THAT THE CLUB HAS PURCHASED THE 16MM SILENT RAILROAD MOVIES FROM THE ESTATE () OF THE LATE CHARTER CLUB MEMBER OTTO C. PERRY. THESE WERE TAKEN BY OTTO OVER A PERIOD OF NEARLY 30 YEARS, AND CONSTITUTE A FINE ADDITION TO THE CLUB'S LIBRARY OF RAILROAD MOVIES. IT IS PROBABLE THAT SOME EDITING AND TITLING WILL BE REQUIRED TO GET THEM INTO FIRST-CLASS CONDITION FOR SHOWING AT CLUB MEETINGS. CRIPPLE CREEK - ROCKY MOUNTAIL RAILROAD CLUB DAYS AT CRIPPLE CREEK -- AUGUST 14 & 15, 1971. CLUB MEMBER JOHN BIRMINGHAM'S CRIPPLE CREEK & VICTOR NARROW GAUGE RAILROAD HAS ACQUIRED ANOTHER STEAM LOCOMOTIVE. THIS TWO FOOT GAUGE, 26-TON, SUPERHEATED LOCOMOTIVE, AN 0-4-0, 0-4-0 WAS BUILT IN 1946 BY BAGNALL IN ENGLAND AND WAS IN SERVICE AT SEZELA, NATAL, SOUTH AFRICA UNTIL RECENTLY. IT ARRIVED IN CRIPPLE CREEK MAY 1ST, 1971, HAS BEEN TESTED, AND WITH SOME MINOR REPAIRS, JOHN HOPES TO HAVE IT IN OPERATION FOR THE CLUB'S WEEKEND, AUGUST 14TH AND 15TH. THE CLUB HAS MADE A FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT WITH JOHN TO HONOR YOUR MEMBERSHIP CARDS AS A PASS FOR YOU AND YOUR FAMILY TO RIDE BETWEEN CRIPPLE CREEK AND ANACONDA ANYTIME DURING THE TWO DAYS AND YOU JUST CAN'T BEAT THAT PRICE FOR STEAM TRAIN RIDING. THREE OTHER TWO-FOOT GAUGE STEAM ENGINES ARE ON THE CC&VNG RR, A HENSCHEL, A KOPPEL, AND A PORTER AND JOHN SAYS THE HENSCHEL AND THE PORTER WILL BE UNDER STEAM FOR SURE, AND ALL THREE OF THE RAILROAD'S COACHES WILL BE IN OPERATION.

AT&SF HAS PROPOSED ABANDONING ITS MAINLINE THRU COLORADO SPRINGS, THUS ELIMINATING A NUMBER OF

GRADE CROSSINGS. THE PROPOSED ABANDONMENT WOULD INCLUDE ALL TRACKAGE FROM CREWS SIDING NEAR WIDEFIELD, 9.6 MILES SOUTH OF COLORADO SPRINGS, TO PALMER LAKE, 23 MILES NORTH. THE AT&SF, C&S AND D&RGW WOULD USE THE EXISTING RIO GRANDE TRACKAGE FOR ITS NORTHBOUND TRAINS BETWEEN CREWS SIDING AND PALMER LAKE AND THESE FACILITIES ARE TO BE ENLARGED AND EXPANDED TO HANDLE THE INCREASED TRAFFIC ONCE ICC APPROVAL IS GIVEN.

UP MOVED INTO THEIR NEW NORTH PLATTE, NEBR. DIESEL SHOP ON APRIL 24, 1971. THE NEW 11 TRACK BUILDING WILL SERVICE SOME 300 LOCOMOTIVES A DAY. THE OLD ROUNDHOUSE WILL BE PHASED OUT OF SERVICE.

THE RAIL STRIKE HAS INTERRUPTED THE SCHEDULE OF THE CHICAGO-SAN FRANCISCO AMTRACK TRAINS, BECAUSE THE UP WAS STRUCK, PASSENGERS WERE BUSSED FROM OGDEN, UTAH TO DENVER, COLORADO UNTIL THE SP WAS ALSO STRUCK. THE STRIKE AGAINST THE UP ALSO FORCED THE ROCK ISLAND TO ROUTE ITS TRAINS FROM LIMON TO COLORADO SPRINGS AND THENCE OVER THE D&RGW TO REACH DENVER.
