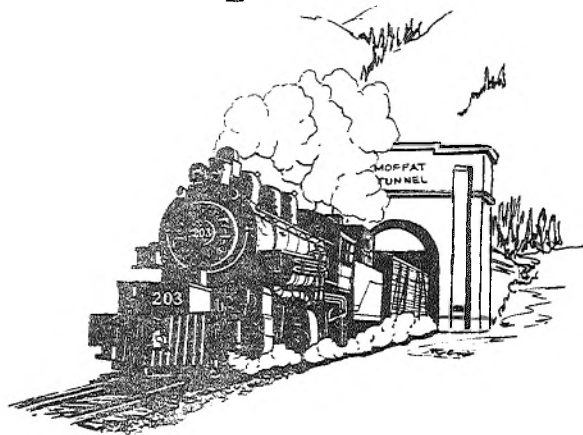

required on the collection before the Library will be in a position to

Loveland, Colorado terminated its mixed train service over its lines from  
Loveland and Longmont to Johnstown, Colo. Passengers were carried in the  
caboose for a number of years prior to the discontinuance. GW also has  
petitioned to abandon about 20 mi. of track between Eaton and Officer Jct.

A NEW PRIVATE railroad has come into existence between Burlington and Alma,  
Kansas. The line uses a portion of an abandoned AT&SF branchline between  
these communities. Operations are to commence around July 1. No word on
