

PROGRAM NOTES: 35mm colored slides of the Milwaukee Road's electrified operations over the Rocky Mountain Division will be shown by Bruce Black.

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NEW TRACKLAYING - The longest Rail line to be put down since 1931, will connect the EN 19-mile branch line serving the Amax Coal Co. near Gillette, Wyo. with the EN Main at Douglas, Wyo, The 126-mile line will cost abount \$32.5 million and will open up the low sulphur coal deposits in Wyoming's Powder River Basin. Unit coal trains will commence operation to Pueblo when the line is completed, about 1975, pending construction approval by the ICC.

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TRAIN SERVICES at the Denver Union Depot are to be taken over by Amtrack shortly. Ownership of the Depot will remain with the Denver Union Terminal Company however.

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THE GN BRANCHLINE between Great Falls, Helena and Butte, Montana has been broken with the abandonment by the BN of the 31-mi. segment between Basin and Butte, Mont., SW of Helena. The old GN depot and roundhouse in Butte have been abandoned by the BN but were still standing as of Oct. 1972. The zinc ore which is still shipped to the smelter in Great Falls, is now routed over the NP via Silver Bow to Garrison, thence to Helena and Great Falls, eliminating the stiffer grade between Butte and Helena, and the necessity for the line.

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MORE OF THE Milw. "old Pelicans" were scrapped this year at Deer Lodge. Below is a list of the Milwaukee Road's electric power on the roster during Oct. 1972. "Old Pelicans" is the name applied to the Milwaukee's Box Cab electrics made in 1915-1916, some of which are still in main line service as helpers and hauling drag freights.

Scrap (Parts Stripping) E25D, E47B, E34D at Deer Lodge Only one electric unit was assigned to the Coast Div., E39A-C-D-E47A, and this was located at Tacoma as per a Sept 72 assignment sheet.

The future of the electric operation: seems very uncertain. No construction on the electrified link between Avery, Idaho and Othello, Wash. was noted. A new order of 30 SD 40-2, received in July, 1972, were in operation on Hotshots 261 thru 264 over the entire Rocky Mountain and Coast Divisions with no assists from the "Joes". The Joes had been relegated to the drag freights 265 and 266 and the numerous extras making up the Milwaukee's fall traffic. The fate of the electrified operation supposedly will be determined next spring (1973).

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UP 833 has been outshopped by the Cheyenne, Wyo. roundhouse and is to be sent to Salt Lake City, Utah as a gift from the railroad. 833 was rolled out of the roundhouse on Oct. 11, 1972 for photographs. The last day of service for 833 was Oct. 30, 1958. Many thanks are in order to those who gave advance notice of this event.

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SPERRY RAIL SERVICE car 137 was spotted in the Denver area on 23 Oct 1972 headed south between Boulder and Denver. The editor would like to contact anyone getting 116-616 photos of it while it was in the area.
