

STEAM FROM DENVER - ENCLOSED IS A FLYER ON THE INTERMOUNTAIN CHAPTER, NRHS 8444 TRIP TO LARAMIE, WYO. ON AUGUST 4TH. IT IS ANTICIPATED AT THIS TIME THAT COMPETING WITH THE LOCOMOTIVE FOR ATTENTION WILL BE ONE OF EX-MILWAUKEE ROADS FAMOUS SKYTOP PARLOR CARS "COON RAPIDS" AS IT BRINGS UP THE END OF THE TRAIN. THE PRIVATELY OWNED CAR WILL TRAVEL FROM THE MIDWEST ON AMTRAK SHORTLY BEFORE THE EXCURSION.

The Intermountain Chapter is also sponsoring a trip over the Cumbres & Toltec Scenic by private car on Saturday, July 14. The ex-Mexican coach, the only true passenger car on the line, will be used on the regular run between Antonito and Chama. Lunch is included in the \$19.00 fare. The same evening a moonlight special will run between Chama and Osier. Lv Chama 6:00 p.m., return around midnight. Fare of \$17.00 includes a steak dinner.

THE OBSERVANCE OF "ALPINE TUNNEL DAYS" THIS YEAR WILL BE HELD AT THE WEST PORTAL OF THE TUNNEL ON SUNDAY, AUGUST 5, 1973, BEGINNING AT 10:30 A.M. AND SHOULD TURN OUT TO BE MORE INTERESTING THAN EVER BEFORE. PRESENT FOR THE OCCASION WILL BE SEVERAL NOTED COLORADO RAIL HISTORIANS WHO WILL REVIEW THE STORY OF THE TUNNEL, AND SEVERAL VETERAN SOUTH PARK RAILROAD MEN, WHO WILL RECOUNT THEIR PERSONAL EXPER-IENCES ON THE FAMOUS LINE. A CONDUCTED HIKE OVER THE CREST OF ALTMAN PASS ABOVE THE TUNNEL TO THE EAST PORTAL WILL ALSO BE MADE. (OR, IF YOU ARE THE AMBITIOUS TYPE, YOU MAY BRING ALONG YOUR PICK AND SHOVEL AND TRY TO USE THE TUNNEL TO GET TO THE OTHER SIDE).

A NUMBER OF RARE AND VALUABLE RR ARTIFACTS ARE TO BE GIVEN AWAY AT THE SITE, INCLUDING SECTIONS OF THE ORIGINAL RAIL FROM THE WEST PORTAL, A MINIATURE DUPLICATE OF THE "TRAIN ORDER" SEMAPHORE THAT GRACED THE FRONT OF THE LITTLE ALPINE TUNNEL DEPOT, SEVERAL BOOKS, AND OTHER GIFTS. COMPLIMENTARY AND COLD DRINKS WILL BE SERVED.

MEMORIAL CEREMONIES WILL BE HELD IN HONOR OF THE LATE MAC POOR, FOREMOST SOUTH PARK RAIL HISTORIAN, AND A NATIVE PINK GRANITE STONE, INSTALLED SOME TIME AGO, WILL BE DEDICATED TO HIS MEMORY.

IF IT HAS BEEN A LONG TIME SINCE YOU'VE VISITED THIS SCENIC AND HISTORIC AREA, OR IF YOU HAVE NEVER TRAVERSED THE ROADBED OF THIS ENGINEERING MARVEL OF THE LATE 1800'S, NOW MAY BE THE OPPORTUNITY FOR A PLEASANT WEEKEND OUTING TO A "HIGHLIGHT OF THE HIGH COUNTRY".

THE CRAIG BRANCH of the D&RGW has been receiving new business this summer in the form of crude oil from eastern Utah. The oil is transported by truck from the Vernal area to Craig, where it is transferred to storage tanks. At normal temperatures the crude has the consistency of heavy grease, so it must be heated before being pumped into waiting tank cars. The specially insulated cars maintain the temperature during the trip, so that upon arrival at the refinery near Denver, the material can be pumped back out for processing.
