

ACCOMPANYING THE LOCO WERE TWO BUSINESS CARS; THE "BABY DOE" AND THE "MOLLY BROWN", AND A U.P. CABCOSE. THE EQUIPMENT IS BEING PULLED BY A DIESEL IN A SPECIAL MOVEMENT WITH A SPEED RESTRICTION OF 15 MPH. IT WAS ESTIMATED AT DEPARTURE TIME THAT SIX DAYS WILL BE REQUIRED FOR THE 1,349 MILE JOURNEY.
