





RAIL SUPPORTERS who wish to protest the D&RGW's petition to drop the western portion of its Rio Grande Zephyr have until January 15, 1979 to get letters in to the Interstate Commerce Commission in Washington, D. C. Between January 15 and 31, the ICC will decide whether to O.K. the railroad's petition or to extend service while it holds hearings on the petition.

NBC TV WILL INTRODUCE a new show in January or February called "Supertrain." It will be a comedy adventure starring an atomic-powered railroad train. The set is one of the largest ever built for television. (Steam and diesel are now passe!) The train will race between Los Angeles and New York, as its passengers enjoy such outlandish features as a swimming pool, book store, gymnasium, boutique, pharmacy, beauty salon, doctor's office, recreation-game room, and a disco. THE D&RGW will operate its ski train to Winter Park again this winter. Train will start January 6, 1979, and end around the last of March or early April. Also, D&RG reported that the Silverton narrow gauge broke its own record this year by hauling 120,384 passengers from May 27 through October 8. During the winter months, they plan to rebuild and renovate some of the narrow gauge passenger cars in Denver's Burnham shops. The Grande also announced that it will spend \$57 million - the largest cash outlay in its history - during 1979, to upgrade its rail system and rolling stock to handle the ever-increasing demand for western coal.

The train took two days to travel between Cheyenne and Ogden, departing Cheyenne on October 17, and returning on the 23rd. Part of this consist was being deadheaded back to Cheyenne after being used on other passenger specials.
