It was 74 years ago in Kankakee, Illinois that the world was introduced to a new dessert, "soft serve ice cream" that became the franchise we know as Dairy Queen. Similarly, little did the visionaries who formed the Rocky Mountain Railroad Club realize in 1938 the impact they would have on Colorado railroad history in the next 74 years.

For example, we have initiated discussions with RTD to host a pre-operational excursion on the new West Corridor light rail line on April 21, 2013. Working with the City of Lakewood, the Denver Tramway Heritage Society, the Intermountain Chapter of the NRHS and the Colorado Railroad Museum, we are planning a trip that will follow some of the same route that Interurban Car #25 followed when it was in operation many years ago.

Although we did not have sufficient response from members to proceed with the two photo trips planned for September of this year, we have decided to look into incorporating one or possibly both into the events to be celebrated during our 75th anniversary next year.

With our planned family outings to Tiny Town on August 18th and to the Greeley Freight Station Museum on November 17th, we hope to encourage members to bring their children and grandchildren to two events that might excite them and capture their imagination.

We will test member's enthusiasm in August to see who is willing to share their personal images (digital or slide) with Club members at a meeting reminiscent of the Slide Potpourri's held more than ten years ago that were organized and emceed by Erwin Chaim. Nathan Homes will be this year's host as we try this format for a bit of variety.

For a little more diversity, we are offering Club members the opportunity to clean house or add to their collections through a "swap" event at the August meeting. If you have memorabilia, books, magazines or other rail artifacts that you'd like to trade, give away or make available for purchase, we will set aside a portion of the meeting for browsing and exchange.

We are still looking for ideas for a logo to be used for the 75th Anniversary. You don't have to be a professional artist to offer suggestions. Send us your thoughts or ideas and we'll ask a graphic designer to help us create the appropriate logo.

Former West Side Lumber Company three-truck Shay #9 is now in service on the Georgetown Loop Railroad.

An abandoned railroad tunnel has created a sinkhole deep enough to close U.S. Highway 24 near Leadville, Colorado. The long-closed tunnel was replaced by a new one in 1945 along the former Denver & Rio Grande Western line over Tennessee Pass.

There is a Colorado Rail Fair in Pueblo on August 11 - 12, 2012 – Saturday and Sunday – 9 AM to 5 PM both days. The Railfair will be held at Colorado State University's Occhiato Center, easily accessible from I-25 on the north side of Pueblo from Exit 101, on the bluff east of I-25.

Santa Fe Railway steam loco #2926 has been in the process of restoration in

Albuquerque, New Mexico. Thieves recently cut the fence and stole some difficult to replace brackets and brake beams, which will likely be sold for a few dollars in scrap value. The "Santa Fe" sign on the top of that railroad's headquarters in downtown Chicago has been taken down. The AT&SF Railway was based at 224 S. Michigan Avenue until 1991.

Nearly five years ago, the Durango Railroad Historical Society bought two freight cars from the D&S NGRR with the intent to restore them. The same group that restored D&RGW #315 has now completed Rio Grande drop-bottom

Norfolk Southern honored many of their predecessor railroads in 2012, its 30th anniversary year, by painting 20 new locomotives in commemorative schemes that reflect the heritage of those predecessors. 10 new GE ES44AC's and 10 new EMD SD70ACe's were used for the Heritage Fleet and will operate on NS Coal Trains. At least two of the locomotives have passed through Colorado on their way to Montana. During the week of July 4th all 20 of the new Heritage Locomotives were gathered for a photo shoot in Spencer, North Carolina, at the North Carolina Transportation Museum, ex-Southern Railway Shops. The 2 day event was open to the public on July 3rd and 4th. The large shop complex was chosen for it's large 37 stall roundhouse and operating turntable. gondola #871. It will be displayed on the Silverton Northern track and join locomotive 315 and the motor car Casey Jones in what is the beginning of the Silverton rail park museum – as a joint project with the San Juan County Historical Society, which now owns the name "Silverton Northern Railroad."

As a follow-up to notes in previous issues, a couple of events did not happen quite as scheduled. Specifically, Rio Grande steam engine #463 has not made any runs yet this year and it is not clear when it may be ready. The Goose Fest at the CRRM did take place in June with six RGS motors in attendance, but the #3 was not there. The crew had gotten it ready to travel to Colorado, but a California management decision one week before the event kept it away from the flock. The Colorado Midland Convention in 2013 will be the week after the 4th of July, at the Mining Museum in Leadville.

In Remembrance Bob Griswold

Bob Griswold was a 63-year member of the Club, holding seniority number 3 at the time of his passing in May 2012. Many will remember Bob as an author. Bob co-authored *Georgetown and the Loop* in 1988. He is most well remembered for these two works, *David Moffat Denver Northwestern and Pacific – The Moffat Road* published in 1995 and *Denver & Salt Lake* published in 1996.

In Remembrance Fred Springer

Fred Springer, a noted member of the rail community, passed away on April 18, 2012. Fred was a 57-year member of the RMRRC. At his passing he held seniority number 19.

He was an avid collector and photographer of everything relating to trains. His collection of books, timetables, and passes was donated to the Railroad & Heritage Museum of Temple, Texas, who named a park next to the Santa Fe Railway depot in his honor. His large photography collection has been donated to the Center for Railroad Photography and Art at Madison, Wisconsin, and Lake Forest College in Illinois. In 1993 he bought the Vista Canyon, a four drawing room, one bedroom lounge car that was the rear end car of the famed "Super Chief". In 2001 he donated the car to the Arizona Railway Museum in Chandler, Arizona.
